Section Phalaenanthe

There are debate about the number of members of this section. Some authorities recognizing 6 species and some 4 in this section. The species from this section are popular horticultural subjects and they are distributed from the Tanimbar Islands, southern New Guinea, the islands of Torres Strait and northern Australia.

Flowers are large, showy, widely opening and long-lasting, in shades of pink, purple and white, and are borne on long arching racemes. The petals and sepals are larger than the lip. The mentum usually has two "chins" (Lavarack et. al 2006).
