General Information:

Selenipedium chica is found in Panama, Choco, Cauca and Nariño Colombia, Ecuador and Peru in well drained very humid areas on roadside banks and the floor of woodlands at elevations of 60 to 90 meters.

General Description:

This plant has been described as large to giant sized, hot growing terrestrial with an elongate, pubescent stem. The leaves are very long, acuminate, basally cuneate-oblong, plicate, and narrowly elliptic. This species blooms in the fall on a terminal, erect, densely pubescent, racemose. Many flowered inflorescences are found with a lanceolate, acute floral bract. Flower size is 1 inch [2.5 cm].
