

WHAT'S IN A NAME

Coelogyne pandurata (see-LAW-ji-nee pan-yoo-RAH-tah)

The genus name is taken from the Greek words koilos (hollow) and gyne (female) which describes the characteristic of having a deep stigmatic cavity. The species name comes from the Latin word panduratus which means fiddle-shaped and describes the shape of the lip.

John Lindley founded this genus in 1821 with one hundred species. Since that time the number of species has been raised several times and the genus is badly in need of a revision. Among the many Coelogyne species are delicately colored flowers with elaborate lip shapes. The inflorescences are usually pendulous so the plants should be planted in hanging baskets. Naturally since the genus is native to such a wide area there is a variety of growing conditions.

Coelogyne pandurata is a large epiphytic plant. The pseudobulbs are oblong, compressed, wedge-shaped and measure up to 12.5 cm. high. The pseudobulbs are fairly close together, have numerous bracts around the bases and are topped by a single large, pleated, long-petioled leaf measuring up to 45.0 cm. long and 7.0 cm. wide. The arching inflorescence has several 10.0 cm. wide, fragrant clear green flowers. The linear-oblong sepals and the almost spathulate petals have acute tips and are widely held forming a perfect setting for the beautiful lip with its crisped undulate edges. The large 3-lobed lip has intense purple-black markings which have given rise to the speculation that Coelogyne pandurata could be the legendary black orchid of literature.


Coelogyne pandurata is found from Malaya to Borneo where it prefers to grow in large trees overhanging lowland rivers.

But, the genus Coelogyne is native to the Philippine Islands, Burma, China, Northern India, Malaya, Borneo and Indonesia.

Bloom season is summer.

You will have better luck growing this species if you give it lots of moving air and bright shade conditions. Since the leaves are deciduous, don't be distressed when last year's leaves turn yellow and fall off.


