WHAT'S IN A NAME? BY GLENDA McINTOSH

Oncidium cavendishianum Batem.

Pronunciation: on-Sid-ee-um cav-en-DISH-ee-ah-num.

The genus name comes from the Latinized Greek word *onkos* meaning mass or swelling and refers to the callus on the lip. The species name honors William George Spencer Cavendish, Duke of Devonshire, and at one time a president of the Royal Horticultural Society, who had his orchid collection at Chatsworth. His grower was the famous Joseph Paxton, regarded as the foremost gardener of his day.


This plant was originally collected near Guatemala City by George Ure Skinner who sent the plant(s) to James Bateman. Bateman flowered the plant the following January and described it in *Orchidacea of Mexico and Guatemala* in 1837.

Distribution: Mexico, Honduras, and Guatemala up to 2800 m.

Synonym: Oncidium pachyphyllum Hooker.

Oncidium cavendishianum is a large epiphytic plant. The pseudobulbs are tiny, up to only 2 cm high concealed by several pointed, distichous, scarious sheaths, a single leaf at the apex. The leaf is erect, broadly lanceolate, up to 45 cm long, 13 cm wide, acute tip. The inflorescence is erect, stout, paniculate up to 150 cm long with many flowers. The showy flowers are 3.8 cm across, very fragrant, sepals and petals yellow or yellowgreen, spotted with reddish-brown, lip deep yellow, callus white with red-brown flecks, column wings red-spotted. Sepals obovate, concave, up to 1.7 cm long, and 1.2 cm wide, rounded, margins crisped- undulate. Petals shortly clawed, obovate, to 1.6 cm long, and 1.1 cm wide, rounded, margins crisped-undulate. Lip deeply 3-lobed, to 2.5 cm long; side lobes obliquely obovate, to 1.3 cm long, and 1.2 cm wide, rounded; midlobe broadly reniform, margins undulate-crisped; callus of erect tubercles below, trilobate-tuberculate above. Column short, thick, to 1 cm high, apex with a falcate, deflexed wing on each side.

This species is closely related to Oncidium bicallosum.
