

Kew Gardens, London



After moving to the UK, he had responsibility for an entire greenhouse at the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew, London to take care of South American and South African section of the orchid collection from 1996 until 1999.

RBG Kew is the greatest privately owned plant collection in the world – property of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen of Great Britain, and The Commonwealth.

His lecture will include very quick familiarization what The RBG Kew -what is, and why is important. There will be many pictures from some of the attractions. But



the main focus will be the Orchid unit – what is being done, how and why. He will also talk about the sections that are NOT OPEN to the public, how the orchids are taken care of and what is done with the collection and why.

In the garden there is a whole "city" for orchids: micropropagation unit, herbarium, orchid library, a large research laboratory (Jodrell) and of course many greenhouses to care and display (as well, to quarantine) orchids and other plants.




