Orchid Hunting in Jamaica

At our April meeting our speaker will be Kathy Creger, who lives in Minnesota but travels to the Caribbean every year and has explored the orchids that inhabit these beautiful islands. She will share some of her experiences studying Jamaican orchids and share insights about their habits that should help us to grow our orchids better.

Kathy started collecting orchids while she was in college at the University of Minnesota in the late 1970's. That interest turned into a serious hobby in the late 1980's and a passion in the early 1990's, when she joined the Orchid Society of Minnesota. She grows several hundred species under lights and in windows during the winter and outside in the summer. She has been President of the Orchid Society of Minnesota, is President of the Pleurothallid Alliance, and is an AOS Accredited Judge in Chicago.

For over 20 years she has gone in Jamaica, learning about, hunting, collecting and documenting orchids on the island. Some plants are common throughout the island and the surrounding Caribbean countries, and some are endemic to one side of a hill. She will discuss various habitats there that will help people to provide better environments for our plants.

Kathy has been a fine goldsmith/jewelry designer for over 30 years and now counts Botanical Illustrator as a job. She painted the cover illustration of Hoosier Orchid Company's catalog for several years and has numerous pieces in Orchids magazine.

Please groom and label your plants and have a list of them (with your name on it also) so all the plants will be returned to their rightful owners. The show will break down Sunday afternoon, and again you will need to either be there to pick up your plants or have someone do that for you.

I will bring some of our "Expose Yourself to Orchids" T-shirts to the meeting, and some of you may want to buy one ahead of time to be able to wear through the show.

Please keep in mind that 3 weeks later is the AOS show in Shreveport which I encourage all of you to go to if possible, and we will need plants for that show also. Look forward to seeing a lot of most of you over the first 2 weeks of April.

Volunteer for the Orchid Show

The upcoming orchid show is going to be fun and informative and a lot of work. Now that it is just a few days away there is still a lot to do and we need volunteers to help on all days for all jobs. There is a job for anyone who can help. Please review the list of jobs and see if you can make some time to come and help out.

Thursday April 7: 10 am – 4 pm: • **Setup**: Arrange tables and get the rooms ready for vendors and exhibitors. Cover the vendor tables with plastic, mark exhibit locations, setup the hospitality room and the lecture room.

Friday April 8: 10 am – 4 pm: • **Vendor and Exhibit Setup:** Volunteers to help vendors and exhibitors set up, carry plants etc.

• 5 pm – 9 pm: **Clerk** for the judges as they review the plants. You don't need to know anything for this job. It is a fantastic opportunity to learn and assist as the judges discuss the good and bad of each plant. They may ask your opinion but mostly you hang ribbons on selected plants or get materials the judges request. Clip boards and pencils provided.

Saturday April 9: 9 am – 5 pm: • **Hospitality**: No cooking, just serving, keep food arranged etc. Make sure people know this is not for the public but for the vendors and workers.

- 9 am 5 pm: The AOS/GNTOS tables: give out info as well as sell T-shirts.
- 9 am 5 pm: Assist the Vendors as needed.
- Potting Demonstrations need volunteers to lead (times to be determined)

Sunday April 10: 9 am – 4:30 pm: • Help out in the kitchen for the vendors and exhibitors. No cooking, just serving and opening food packages and smiling.

- 9 am 5 pm: Assist the Vendors if they need help
- Potting Demonstrations need volunteers to lead (times to be determined)
- Teardown: Put everything away. Help the vendors and exhibitors packup

Those who sign up for food need to indicate what they are bringing and when. Hank will have a sign up sheet for the AOS/GNTOS information table. 2 hour shifts preferred but any time is appreciated.
