Schombo-Love 101





Paul and Mary Storm are hobbyists who have a passion for anything "SCHOMBO" and their nursery in Sarasota, Florida holds what is believed to be the largest collection of Schombo-

Laelia and Myrmecophila species and hybrids anywhere. Their love of orchids, have brought them invitations to many societies around the U.S., Central America and the Caribbean.

Paul is the botanical author of Myrmechea as well as several future Nothogenera. He is actively involved in hybridizing several genera with schoms that have never been combined before. Paul is the botanical author of two RHS accepted Nothogenera and the RHS Registrar has created Stormara as a new orchid genus. Some outstanding nurseries and hybridizers have named schom hybrids after Paul in honor of his schom mission.

We're coming into the month of February – still cool weather, but getting to be time for some repotting. My cattleyas and a few others are starting to show new growth and new roots and so could handle repotting. Kathi will be giving a repotting demo during the 101 presentation before our regular meeting, so be sure and attend if

you're not too sure about that process. And always feel free to bring to the monthly meeting a plant about which you have questions. If you think it's diseased and need to ask about it, please keep the plant at home and just bring a good description of the problem, so you don't spread the disease!

Even though it's been a mild winter, if you grow in your home and not a greenhouse, your orchids can always benefit from some well-placed humidifiers. Home humidity during the winter, even with daytime temperatures in the 60's, can be around 35% or less. Putting out one or two humidifiers can raise humidity by 10% or more, depending upon the room conditions. I use filterless ones and try to mix in at least some distilled water with the tap water to prevent a build-up of white residue from the unfiltered water. I also have a humidity/temperature gauge that I keep amongst my orchids so I can monitor the conditions in their area.

We're going to have a list going around during our next meeting for volunteers to sign up to bring snacks for the rest of the year. Many hands make light work, so let's be ready to help out in that area.

I really enjoyed Marguerite Webb's talk and looking over all the different genera she brought for sale. And now I'm trying to learn how to grow some new orchid species! That's one of the things that intrigues me so about orchids – the tremendous variety. It's not hard to find ones to like and learn about!


