Alan Koch owns and operates Gold Country Orchids where he specializes in miniature and compact Cattleya's. Alan started growing orchids in 1969 with 3 Cymbidiums given to him by an aunt. While in college he became interested in other orchids and discovered many would grow outdoors in Southern California. He has moved five times as his orchid obsession has led to

the need for more growing space. With the last move, he purchased 10 acres of

He is recognized as an expert in the Brazilian Cattleva alliance and a trend setter in miniature Cattleva breeding. He is a past member of the AOS Judging Committee, and the Research Committee, as well as an Accredited Judge for the California Sierra Nevada Judging Center.

GNTOS Meeting Minutes for October 7, 2012

Kathi McKenzie conducted "Orchids 101" before the general meeting. She distributed a handout, "How Do I Feed My Orchid?"

President Lorna Kissling called the meeting to order at 3:15 p.m. She described the staffing requirements for the variety of activities for the forthcoming Orchid Show and requested members to volunteer and signup. Emily Quinn described the types of plants that would be appropriate for the Society table top exhibit.

Kevin Fox, Vice-President, introduced the speaker, Weyman Bussey, who presented a program on "Laelias and Allies in Mexico: where they come from and how they grow." The presentation on the 12 (twelve) species included weather maps, topical maps, distribution maps, as well as geographical maps with cities and volcanos. Weyman included pictures of flowers, plants, and habitats. Some habitats were shown in both the dry and wet seasons. One of the novelties was an orchid vocabulary quiz in the middle of the presentation. The graphics were colorful and humorous. The presentation ended with advertisements of programs on other subjects. This program was humorous and very well done.

There was one visitor, a Bolivian, who is now living in the area. Mike Beber conducted the plant raffle. Nancy Cropp announced the results of the plant table and congratulated the ribbon winners.

Miltonia spectabilis

The Miltonia genus was identified by John Lindley in 1837, and named after Lord Fitzwilliam Milton, an English orchid enthusiast. M. spectabilis is the largest flowered of the Brazilian Miltonias (other Brazilian miltonias are M.anceps, M. candida, M. clowesii, M. cuneata, M. flavescens, M. kayasimae, M. regnellii, and M. russelliana). M. spectabilis is found along the east coast of Brazil, from the State of Pernambuco in the north through Bahia, Espirito Santo, Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo.

M. spectabilis produces fewer flowers on shorter inflorescences than most in this group, however with its wide lip, the flowers are the largest of these Miltonias. Because of its large flowers and its warmth tolerance, M. spectabilis has been used widely in hybridizing.

The plants are not large, but tend to produce two growths on each pseudobulb, so the plants can branch and grow to large specimens quickly. M. spectabilis likes moderate light, high humidity, and intermediate to warm temperatures. The bloom season is spring and/or fall. Blooms are typically born singly on an inflorescence, and can be up to 3" tall x 4" wide.

The bloom color is quite variable, and can range from alba and semi-alba forms through the deep colors of var. Moreliana.
